



Worship Director Opportunity

Questions & Answers

Is the Worship Director a full-time or a part-time position?

The Worship Director is a 16-hour-a-week, part-time, locally-hired staff position.

What are the educational requirements?

The ideal Worship Director will have a Bachelor's degree in Worship Arts, Music Ministry, or similar.

What experience is necessary?

The ideal Worship Director will have previous experience leading worship in a local church setting as either an intern or staff member.

What will the Worship Director do?

- Lead the musical worship experience each week during the morning worship service and other occasional services as requested
- Create the musical worship visuals each week for the morning worship service and other occasional services as requested
- Build relational and ministry connections with the local music community, with special emphasis on Lebanon Valley College
- Recruit, train, and support a team or teams of musicians and singers from both inside and outside the St. John's Church family (composed of people who have faith in Christ)
- Lead praise team practices
- Recruit, train, and support a team of musical worship A/V volunteers
- Provide musical accompaniment for the choir as requested

Will the Worship Director lead the choir?

No, Bob Sheetz will remain the Choir Director.

What about the current Praise Team?

Anyone with musical talent, including current Praise Team members, is welcome to serve with the Worship Director as new musical opportunities are created.

Who will oversee this position?

The Worship Director will report to and will be supported by the Senior Pastor.

Where will we find ideal candidates?

St. John's has partnered with Grace Community Church in Willow Street, PA, whose Worship Pastor leads a Worship Director internship program at the church and has various connections with other ideal candidates in the area.

Is this a paid position?

Yes, the Worship Director may choose to receive either (1) a salary or (2) use of the parsonage if available, but not both.
